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Effects Of A Discharge Planning

Discharge planning is a widespread process - nurses are frequently involved in planning and coordinating discharge. Discharge planning aims to decrease time spent in hospital, improve patient outcomes and reduce costs. The evidence is not clear over whether discharge planning reduces costs or shifts them from secondary to primary care. Further research is needed to determine if discharge planning reduces readmission rates.

Examining rates of readmission beyond the industry standard of 30 days revealed the sustained effect of discharge planning for hospitalized patients. It appears essential that psychiatric inpatients have postdischarge outpatient appointments in place to minimize relapse.

Discharge planning reduces patient harm, improves safety and facilitates improved patient outcomes. 18 The literature also highlights that the system focus has traditionally been on technical aspects of discharge planning, such as arranging prescriptions and monitoring adherence, rather than on post-discharge coping mechanisms. 18 What stands out to us is the need for more implementation studies that bring together the key stakeholders in an evidence-informed, patient-centered approach.

Effects of early discharge planning on length of hospital stay. Farren EA. This experimental research tests the effect of discharge planning on length of hospital stay. In this study of 432 medical patients in a southwestern medical center, discharge planning implemented within 24 hours of hospital admission significantly reduced length of stay.

Hospital discharge is a complex and challenging process for healthcare professionals, patients, and carers. Effective discharge planning could significantly improve a patient's health and reduce patient readmission [1 - 6].

Barriers to effective discharge planning: a qualitative ...

Based on the individual needs of the patient, effective discharge planning supports the continuity of health care between the health-care setting and the community; it is described as “the critical link between treatment received in hospital by the patient, and post-discharge care provided in the community 3.”

The cost of discharge when it goes wrong can place a significant burden both on the lives of individuals and on resources. A YouGov poll carried out in June 2015 found that nearly a fifth of people who have been discharged from hospital in the last 3 years did not feel they received all the social care support they needed after leaving hospital.

Poor discharge practice leading to 'unnecessary patient ...

Rehospitalization rates were calculated for 90, 180, 270, and 365 days after discharge to examine effects over time of keeping an initial appointment. RESULTS: Of the 542 patients who were rehospitalized, 136 kept at least one outpatient appointment after discharge from their initial admission; 406 did not.

Effects of Discharge Planning and Compliance With ...

For 73.3% of this group, problems did not emerge until after discharge. Intervention patients were more likely than usual care patients to have scheduled and completed physician visits by 30 days post discharge. There were no differences between groups on patient or caregiver stress or hospital readmission.

Effects of an enhanced discharge planning intervention for ...

has an in-depth psychosocial need (IDPN, defined by inpatient hospital discharge planning staff as a non-medical issue that may complicate care, such as financial or insurance problems, coping issues, family conflict, and other similar factors) documented in the discharge planning assessment.

Conclusion: Structured discharge planning per guideline recommendations can help improve transitions in care for patients with diabetes. A team based, patient-centered approach can help improve patient outcomes by reducing medication errors, delay of care, and hospital readmissions.
